Being a caregiver is one of the most important roles you will ever have in your life. It doesn't matter if you're the parent, spouse, child, friend or neighbor of a loved one who needs care. Your responsibility is to help create a safe environment that promotes healing and encourages independence - and it will sometimes feel overwhelming.

Caregiver Basics has been designed with you - the caregiver - in mind. It will provide valuable information and let you know you are not alone.

Fortunately, there are assistive devices and community resources that offer support and assistance. Over the course of a few hours, knowledgeable speakers at *Caregiver Basics* will discuss programs and services to help you and the individual for whom you are providing care. They will answer questions like:

- Is the home accommodating to the needs of the individual?
- What's out there to help the individual be as independent as possible?
- Where can I find help and how do I pay for it?

In addition to the valuable information you will receive from the speakers, all participants will receive a free gift bag of low cost-low tech assistive devices to take home with them.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

You do not need to be a health care provider to attend *Caregiver Basics*. In fact, **family caregivers are particularly invited** whether the loved one is already home or is scheduled to return home soon.

However, continuing education units have been obtained to encourage professionals to refresh their knowledge of what is available to help individuals and their families.

Caregiver Basics is recommended for family caregivers, nursing home aides, personal care home aides, home health employees, visiting homemakers, LPNs and students.

Caregiver Basics will be held at the OLLI Classrooms at Mountaineer Mall. This facility and parking are accessible.

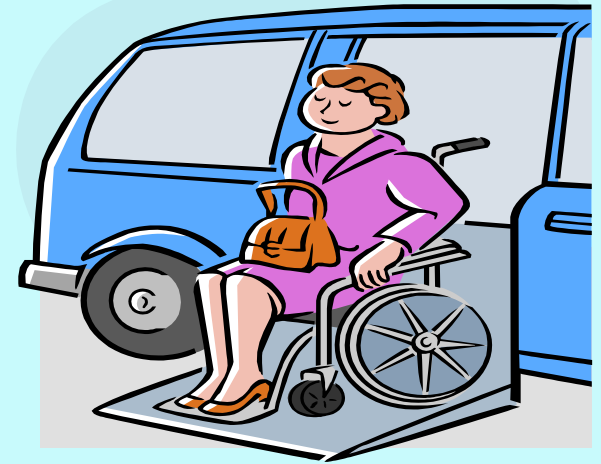
