Program Overview and Objectives

The 2016 West Virginia Geriatrics Society Scientific Assembly, "Helping Our Patients Make Decisions" is designed to enhance the care of the geriatric population in the end of life for physicians, nurses, pharmacists and social workers. This activity will address issues related to hospice care, palliative care, immunizations, statistics of care, and social and environmental needs of the geriatric community in an effort to improve geriatric care.

The Proposed content of the CME relates to the diversities seen in our state due to the rural nature of our state. This CME in line with the national American Geriatric Society will allow for the collaborative practice of all disciplines that are involved in Geriatric care of our state. We will increase the knowledge as well as discuss the potential ways the multiple disciplines can and should work together in their scopes of practice. 
