Target Audience

This conference is planned for an interdisciplinary audience of physicians, nurses, pharmacists, social workers, hospital administrators and other interested healthcare professionals.

Program Overview and Objectives

The 2014 West Virginia Geriatrics Society Scientific Assembly “**Care Across the Continuum: One Family’s Journey**” is designed for healthcare providers and others interested in learning about various levels of medical care provided to older adults with complex medical conditions.

Sessions will address a wide array of the most current clinical, program and policy issues facing providers, patients, and family caregivers. Attendees will receive meaningful information and tools to incorporate into their own work in caring for older adults in preventive, acute, post-acute, long-term care, and end-of-life settings. After attending the Assembly attendees will be able to:

- ◆ describe components of new Medicare benefits for older adults, such as the Welcome to Medicare Visit and the Annual Wellness Visit;
- ◆ recognize acute care issues, such as delirium, that can present in older adults upon hospitalization;
- ◆ explain updates to Medicare guidelines and policies related to various levels of care provision, including re-admissions to hospitals, care provided in skilled nursing facilities, and services provided by home health agencies;
- ◆ specify clinical guidelines for wound care when considering treatments for skin related complications of older adults with chronic illnesses;
- ◆ identify decision-making protocols and community resources, such as hospice care, when working with older adults facing end-of-life issues.

Poster Competition

As part of the Scientific Assembly, WVGS is sponsoring its annual trainee poster competition. The winning poster presenter will receive an award stipend to attend the 2015 American Geriatrics Society (AGS) Annual Meeting in National Harbor, Maryland May 15-17, 2015. Several past WVGS poster winners also have had their posters accepted into the AGS Annual Meeting poster competition.
